**Remaining Silent:
The fifth amendment gives every person the right to not answer questions asked by the police or government**

The Right To Be Free From Unreasonable Search or Seizure
The fourth amendment is supposed to protect your privacy from government intrusion.

Police cannot search you, your home, or your possessions unless you consent. (Your silence can give police

consent) , Police obtain a search warrant, An exception to the search warrant requirement exists such as;

An illegal item being in plain view, stop and Frisk laws, An officer or government agent believes that a person is in danger (hears a scream in a house), An officer is in "hot pursuit" of a fleeing suspect, or the automobile exception which allows officers to search specific parts of an automobile if the officer must has probable cause to believe that the vehicle contains evidence of a crime, the instrumentality of a crime, or the fruits of a crime. Whether the vehicle is moving or already stopped is irrelevant.

Without a warrant, your consent, or the presence of an exception police or government agents may not search you and you have the right to refuse to let them search

You Must Say Out Loud "I do not consent to this search"

otherwise it is assumed your consent is given

The Right to Advocate for Change

In Public places all persons have maximum first amendment rights

In Quasi-Public places a permit may be required to exercise maximum first amendment rights lawfully

In Private Places the owner or person in charge may ask you to leave or declare that you are trespassing which is a crime. The first amendment protects the rights of groups and individuals to advocate for change in laws, government practices, and the form of government

ICE may deport non citizens for deportation because of their first amendment activities as long as the may deport them for other reasons
